St Peter's Cathedral Service 5th Sept

On Saturday 5 September at 10am there will be a service in St Peter's Cathedral to receive the gift of a Reconciliation Cope from the Anglican Communion Office to the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Anglican Council (NATSIAC). The Cope will be presented to NATSIAC by the Most Reverend Ric Thorpe, Archbishop of Melbourne. At this service Bishop Chris McLeod will conclude his time as National Aboriginal Bishop. The preacher at this service will be the Most Reverend Don Tamihere, Primate of the Tikanga Māori of the Anglican Church in Aotearoa, New Zealand, and Polynesia. All welcome! NATSIAC and the Anglican Indigenous Network will be meeting at the Cathedral 1 – 7 September.

Over recent months, Anglicans from across the Diocese have gathered in conversation, prayer and discernment to reflect on the next phase of our shared vision: **Adelaide Anglicans Flourishing and United in God's Love**.

Through workshops held around the Diocese, people have identified hopes, challenges and opportunities for our common life and mission. Themes such as discipleship, leadership development, church growth, collaboration, community engagement and sharing the Gospel have featured strongly in these conversations.

To ensure as many voices as possible are heard, we are now inviting people from across the Diocese [to complete a short online survey](#).

The survey:

- summarises key themes emerging from the consultation process so far;
- asks which areas you believe should receive greater diocesan focus;
- invites you to identify what we should continue, start or stop doing; and
- provides an opportunity to share any additional hopes for the future.
